BATTRIES FOR DRYWASHING

Try not to use car or motor cycle batteries. These are made for motors that need power to turn them over, where they get the term cranking amps, and these are rated by how many cranking amps they put out. They put out a lot of push, but won't last very long! About a couple hours then they start to fade. If that is all you have its OK use them!

HERE'S WHAT TO USE! They are called SEALED LEAD ASID BATTERIES and are rated by their voltage and by ampere-hours, Ampere hours is the amount of time the battery can give out. These batteries come in different sizes to fit your choice, I can take a small one, measuring 4 inches in high

X 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ wide x 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ depth and weight about 2 lbs. it is rated at 12 volts and is a 5 Ah. This will power my Drywasher for 4 to 5 hrs. and is great for prospecting or traveling light.

Car batteries are charged with a battery charger and are charged fast, but these Sealed Lead ASID Batteries are charged very slow and that is where it gives back its power slow. You charge these with a trickle charge or a solar panel. A new battery in most cases require 14 hrs. charge before first use, after that it's o.k., but always charge overnight if it needs it!

My favorite is a 12 volt 12 Ah which will last me up to three days dry washing at Coolgardie, and I always take a backup!


You can find these batteries on line at amazon.com and some electronic shops. Harbor Freight sells one for their solar panels, it's a 12 volt 36 Ah battery a little heavy but will last about a week without recharging, about \$70.00 a little high but look at the service you would get. Your home phones now have a backup battery which is a 7 Ah 12 Volt battery.
