# People VS Rinehart 3<sup>rd</sup> Court of Appeals Decision on Dredging

The Third Appellate District reversed a judgment and remanded. The court held that further proceedings were necessary for the purpose of determining whether Fish and Game Code provisions, as applied, were preempted by federal law because they rendered his right to mine gold from a river commercially impracticable.

Brandon Rinehart and several others owned two contiguous mining claims for recoverable gold located in a national forest. Rinehart was working with vacuum and suction dredge equipment in waters that were within the boundaries of one of those claims that was known as Nugget Alley. A state game warden cited Rinehart under Fish & Game Code §5653.

Rinehart was later charged under §5653(a) with using such equipment without a permit and under §5653(d) with possessing such equipment in an area that was closed to the use of that equipment. Rinehart demurred, arguing that in light of §5653.1 as amended, the state had "indefinitely suspended the issuance of all permits for suction dredging, closing all waters of the state to" that use pending a determination that it would not be deleterious to fish. The trial court overruled the demurrer.

Rinehart then agreed to a bench trial on stipulated facts. Rinehart asserted an affirmative defense that §5653 was unenforceable against him because as applied, the statute was preempted by federal law. Rinehart made an offer of proof, contending that if admitted into evidence, his testimony would show that §5653 was unenforceable under the circumstances of his case.

The facts to which Rinehart and the People stipulated included that Rinehart had permits as required by the law when they were available and would have continued to apply for such permits if permits were being issued. The parties further stipulated that the trial court could accept into evidence a 2013 document entitled "California Department of Fish and Wildlife Report to the Legislature Regarding in stream Suction Dredge Mining under the Fish & Game Code."

Following argument, the trial court found that Rinehart's prosecution under §5653(a) and (d) was not federally preempted. The court allowed into evidence those parts of Rinehart's offer of proof that concerned the discovery and ownership of the claims, the acceptance of those claims by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Rinehart's having found no significant quantities of gold outside the water-covered areas of the Nugget Alley claim, and that the gold on that claim lay under its waters.

However, the court excluded from evidence those parts of Rinehart's offer of proof that concerned suction dredging being the only economically-feasible method by which gold could be extracted from the Nugget Alley claim. Based on the evidence before it, the court then found Rinehart guilty under §5653(a) and (d) and granted him summary probation. Rinehart appealed.

The court of appeal reversed and remanded, holding that whether §§5653 and 5653.1 operated to make Rinehart's rights under federal law commercially impracticable could not be resolved on this record.

The court pointed out that §5653, standing alone, did not contravene federal law by requiring a state permit for suction dredge mining. Rather, the U.S. Supreme Court has held that requiring a state permit to conduct specified activities on federal land is not categorically prohibited. The issue here turned on the conditions attending the permit. Specifically, Rinehart contended there was a de facto ban on suction dredge mining imposed by the state through the operation of §§5653 and 5653.1. Thus, Rinehart argued, the state had taken from him what the federal government had granted, since there was no economically feasible way to extract mineral deposits in the Nugget Alley claim.

The court found that Rinehart made a colorable argument that, under federal law, §\$5653 and 5653.1 were environmental regulations that were so severe that mining had become commercially impracticable. As such, Rinehart contended, §\$5653 and 5653.1 were de facto land use planning measures that frustrated rights granted by the federal mining laws and were thus obstacles to the realization of Congress' intent in enacting those laws. But the court concluded that on this record, it could not determine that as a matter of law, the criminal provisions of §5653, read in light of the provisions of §5653.1, were unenforceable based on those statutes making commercially impracticable the exercise of rights granted by federal mining laws.

In particular, the trial court found that the statutes were not preempted and disallowed evidence relevant to the disputed question. Thus, there was no relevant evidence as to Rinehart's affirmative defense. As a result, remand was necessary for further proceedings on preemption. Specifically, the trial court had to address whether §5653.1 as currently applied operates as a practical matter to prohibit the issuance of permits required by §5653. The trial court also had to address whether, if that is so, such a de facto ban on suction dredge mining permits renders commercially impracticable the exercise of Rinehart's mining rights as granted by the federal government.

It has come to the attention of the Valley Prospector's board, that we need to revise our Rules and Regulations under Article III (3), Dues and Initiation Fees: This is asked as a question because it will be a yes or no vote at January 2015 General Meeting.

### Proposal for the Rules / Regs for Dues

This is what has been proposed:

Shall New Members, who join Valley Prospector's Inc. on or after November 1st to December 31, have the dues part of their initiation apply to the following year?

This is to be posted in the Newsletter for 2 month (Nov., and Dec.) and then voted on at the General Meeting by the members in January 2015.

This is for New Members, who become members at the end of a year.

If not approved by the members, then it will be up to the membership chair as to when this date will be, as it has been Since the start of V.P
